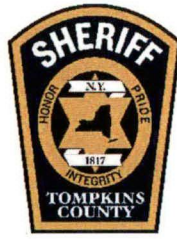

## **Public Safety Committee Report – November 2017**

### ***Section 1.01 Department Activities:***

- For the month of November, the Tompkins County Sheriff's Office had participated in the "No Shave November" event. This event was prompted by the Corrections and Road Patrol Divisions. They were using this event to fundraise for the Project Lifesaver Program. They were able to raise \$1,140.00 toward the program
- November 7<sup>th</sup>- A meeting was held with LaBella Associates to evaluate the needs of the Tompkins County Sheriff's Office Road Patrol, Administrative and Jail spaces.
- November 8<sup>th</sup>- Undersheriff Robison attended the OD Map Technical Demo at the Health Department.
- November 9<sup>th</sup>- Captain Bunce and Undersheriff Robison attended the Basic Correction Academy Graduation for Katelyn Schramm in Chenango County.
- November 12<sup>th</sup>- The Sheriff's Office participated in a seven vehicle motorcade, with the State Police, in support of the Lansing boys' soccer team, for their win over Byron-Bergen.
- November 13<sup>th</sup>- 15<sup>th</sup>- The New York State Commission of Correction came in to evaluate our policy and procedures in order to maintain our Accreditation status.
- November 14<sup>th</sup>- Sheriff Lansing attended the Cops, Kids, and Toys meeting to discuss the upcoming holiday events. Additionally, Sheriff Lansing and Undersheriff Robison attended the LEAD National Support Bureau Meeting that was held at the Old Jail.
- November 16<sup>th</sup>- Sheriff Lansing attended the Cayuga Addiction Recovery Services committee meeting and the STOP DWI Advisory board meeting. Undersheriff Robison attended the Deputy Cabinet Meeting. Both the Undersheriff and Sheriff attended the Public Safety meeting and the Jail Study committee meeting.

- November 28<sup>th</sup>- The Project Lifesaver team attended the “Evening to Remember” at the Statler Hotel at Cornell. They had a booth to inform the public of the services that the Tompkins County Sheriff’s Office Project Lifesaver Program offers the community.

***Section 1.02 Sheriff’s Office Media Releases***

- **Larceny Arrest- November 9<sup>th</sup>, 2017**

- On November 9<sup>th</sup>, 2017 at about 7:05 PM, deputies responded to the Target Store located at 40 Catherwood Road in the Village of Lansing, for a larceny arrest. Loss prevention reportedly witnessed a female conceal merchandise and exit past all points of sale without paying for the items.
- Deputies identified the suspect as NICOLE L. CHAFFEE (Age 30 of Groton). CHAFFEE was charged with petit larceny and was later released on an appearance ticket. She is set to appear in the Town of Lansing Court on November 30<sup>th</sup>, 2017 at 3:00 PM.

- **DWAI Arrest- November 14<sup>th</sup>, 2017**

- Deputies stopped a white Jeep for traveling at a high rate of speed on Danby Road in the Town of Ithaca. Deputies identified the driver of the vehicle as MARCUS J. WEATHERSBY, age 22 of Ithaca, NY. Through further investigation, deputies determined that WEATHERSBY was under the influence of drugs and arrested WEATHERSBY.
- WEATHERSBY was charged with Driving While Ability Impaired by Drugs, Speed in Zone and Unlawful Possession of Marihuana. WEATHERSBY was released to a sober third party and is to appear in the Town of Ithaca Court on December 21, 2017 at 9:00 AM.

- **Larceny Arrest- November 16<sup>th</sup>, 2017**

- On November 16<sup>th</sup>, 2017 at about 6:15 PM, deputies responded to the Target Store located at 40 Catherwood Road in the Village of Lansing for a larceny complaint.

Asset protection staff reportedly observed a female conceal store merchandise on her person and walk past all points of sale without paying for the items.

- The suspect was identified as ZSATIA M. PERKINS (Age 27 of Ithaca). PERKINS posted police bail and was released with an appearance ticket. She is set to appear in the Town of Lansing Court on December 5th, 2017 at 9:00 AM.

- **Larceny Arrest- November 21<sup>st</sup>, 2017**

- On November 21st, 2017 at about 5:00 PM, deputies responded to the area of 22 Arrowwood Drive in the Village of Lansing for a suspicious incident report. A victim reported observing a male suspect with a face mask inside her parked vehicle. After confronting the suspect, she reported that he exited and dropped stolen property of hers near the vehicle. The suspect was detained shortly after and identified as CARLETTE CROWE (Age 54 of Varna).
- CROWE was charged with Petit Larceny and Criminal Possession of Stolen Property in the 5th Degree. CROWE was arraigned and released on his own recognizance. CROWE was later arrested on a violation of parole warrant and transported to the Tompkins County Public Safety Building without bail.
- The Village of Cayuga Heights Police Department also assisted in the incident.

- **Death Investigation- November 24<sup>th</sup>, 2017**

- JOSHUA REEVES, 31, of Dryden, NY, died at 10:58 AM, Friday, November 24th, 2017 while incarcerated at the Tompkins County Jail. MR. REEVES death does not appear to be suspicious in nature and there is no indication of foul play. A determination into the cause of death is still under investigation.
